It is now officially time to Think Spring:

From an education standpoint, this is a critical time in the school year. All of us are dealing with the effects of the long winter season, with its cold, snow, and ice, and some of us are suffering from the seasonal affect disorder brought about by lack of sunshine. The good news is that the 'winter doldrums' are nearly over and will be replaced by warmer temperatures and extended sunlight. The bad news is that the warmer weather and longer days signal the start of spring activities. At this time, it is easy for students to lose focus on what's important. I would encourage you to take the time and give your children a 'pep talk' about maintaining a focus on their school work. At this point in their lives, school is their 'job' and it is important for them to put forth their best efforts in the classroom.

As of the day my article for the March district newsletter was written, we had only missed two days of school due to inclement weather and those days will both be made up by extending the current school year two days. Students will now attend classes on Tuesday, May 24, and Wednesday, May 25. Graduation is still set for Sunday afternoon, May 22, beginning at 2:00.

At the February 14 regular school board meeting, your board approved the school calendar for 2011-2012. You can find the 2011-2012 school calendar link on the Martensdale St. Marys district web site. Next year's school calendar includes registration dates on Wednesday, August 10, and Thursday, August 11; a school year start date for students on Wednesday, August 24; fall parent-teacher conferences during the first week of November; a twelve-day holiday vacation from December 22 through Monday January 2, 2012; spring parent-teacher conferences during the week of March 12-16, with a full week of spring break beginning on March 19; graduation for seniors on Sunday, May 20; and the end of the school year for all other students on the Thursday before Memorial Day, May 24.

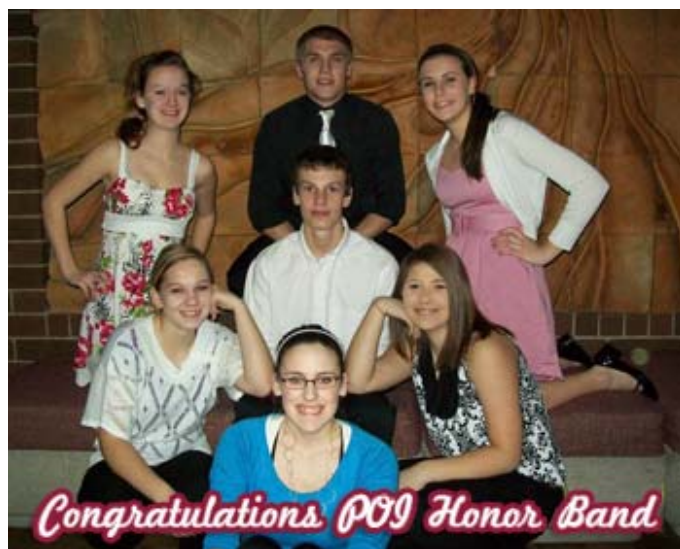

Reminder... The experts encourage everyone to apply for financial aid even if you don't think you will qualify. They also encourage families to apply as early as possible! If you have any questions about this application, or for more information on eligibility requirements you can call 1-800-4FED-Aid, look on the Internet at www.ed.gov/studentaid or contact Mr. Folkerts. Additional new scholarships have been mailed to my office over the past few weeks. Please encourage your son or daughter to stop by my office and check out those opportunities! Also, a quick reminder, I will disperse all local scholarship information the week of March 7th -10th to all seniors. All local scholarships are due in my office Friday, March 25th at 3:00...no exceptions!!

Here are a few more ideas all junior and seniors should be working on....

March Senior Reminders 2011

- If you have not yet submitted your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), you should complete it as soon as possible.
- Keep copies of your completed federal tax returns handy. Be prepared to mail them to your college(s) if requested to do so. Promptly respond to any document requests made by your college.
- Expect your Student Aid Reports (SAR) within 2 – 4 weeks from the time you filed your FAFSA.
- Make sure your first semester transcripts have been sent to the college(s) to which you have applied.

Junior Reminders 2011

- Investigate careers. Link to information about various careers on the web site www.ICANSucceed.org or www.ihaveaplaniowa.gov
- Make sure your senior year includes required credits to meet the college entrance requirements. Consider taking honors or college level classes while still in high school.
- Put together a resume listing of your activities, volunteer experiences, academic achievements and employment.

Having Successful Parent-Teacher Conferences

It doesn't matter if you're the student, the teacher, or the parent, parent-teacher conferences are bound to cause some anxiety. Yet these one-on-one meetings are priceless opportunities for families to get a better understanding of their children. By preparing well for your meetings with teachers and following up with both your children and their teachers afterward, you can strengthen your children's school success.

Before the Conference:

Listen.

Any time you hear your child talking about something he or she is doing really well in or is having trouble with—either with schoolwork or with classmates—make a note of it. When it's time for the conference with the teacher, you'll have a ready-made list of things to discuss.

Ask.

When it's time to schedule the conference with the teacher, sit down with your child and ask him or her what you should discuss with the teacher. Encourage your children to open up and tell you what it's like for them in the classroom. Do they feel like they're falling behind academically? Or are they bored because they understand the material that the rest of the

class is struggling with? Are there any troubling issues with any of their classmates? One thing that's guaranteed to get your children to open up is asking them what they think their teacher is going to tell you about them.

Bring notes and papers.

Write down questions you want to address with the teacher. Bring copies of any assignments you have questions about. Think ahead of time how to be tactful and kind in wording concerns you have about the teacher or the class.

During the Conference:

Be on time.

Schools tightly schedule parent-teacher conferences because there's only so much time available and dozens of families to see. Show up at least a few minutes early, so you know you'll be set to begin when it's your turn.

Hire a babysitter.

It's important to make sure that the time you have with the teacher is as productive as possible. Having other children in the room is distracting. Either hire a babysitter or trade off with another parent so that your children don't tag along.

Take notes.

In addition to presenting the questions and concerns you brought to the meeting, make sure to take notes about what the teacher is telling you about your child. Be sure to address these important areas: strengths, weaknesses, and social skills.

Keep emotions out of it.

It is always difficult to hear that your "angel" or "young Einstein" isn't exactly the person you thought he or she was in the classroom. Keep your cool and bear in mind that the teacher is offering constructive criticism.

After the Conference:

Talk to your child.

Sit down with your child and tell him or her what you and the teacher discussed. Emphasize the positive things the teacher said. Remember that it's important for your child to feel positive about learning, the teacher, and the school.

Follow up.

If there were important issues that need to be dealt with, such as finding a tutor or getting counseling for your child, make sure to follow up in writing with the teacher soon after the conference. Specify exactly what you discussed with the teacher, what steps will be taken, what your responsibilities and the school's responsibilities will be, and what the timetable is for action.

Remember the principal.

If, after meeting with your child's teacher, you still feel like you have serious issues that weren't adequately addressed, set up a time to talk to the guidance counselor or principal to see what other options are available.

Follow through.

Once you know what you can do at home to help your child succeed in school, make sure to actually do it. It's understandable that finding the time might be difficult, but remember—your child needs you.

On a personal note, I will be starting my maternity leave sometime during the first week of March and will not return until the end of April. Martha West will be my substitute

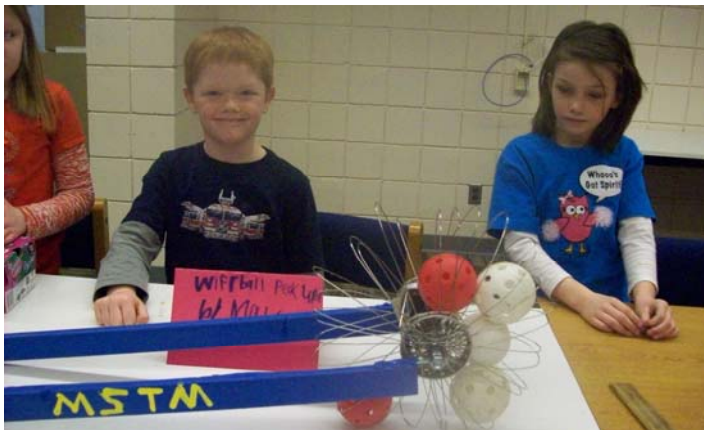

I. Welcome

Board President Bunch called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and welcomed all guests.

II. Consent Items

- A. Approval of Minutes Board President
- B. Approval of Agenda Board President
- C. Approval of Bills and Secretary's Report Board President
- D. Approval of Hot Lunch and Activity Reports Board President

Gibson motioned to approve the consent items seconded by Shutt. Roll call: 4 ayes.

III. Celebrations

Mr. Crozier announced that we made it through the first semester with minimum problems and no snow days. It has been a great year so far! He also announced that the girls basketball team is rated #1 again.

The Board read the thank you letter from Emily Hutcheson. She thanked the District for receiving the Lester Phren Scholarship.

Ron Peterson announced that he just received notification today that the Central Iowa Sports Commission announced that our 2010 Championship Baseball Team is one of five finalists for "Team of the Year". More information will be sent out tomorrow to vote for our team. Congratulations!

Harper requested this information to be in the newsletter. Mr. Crozier announced a successful turnout for the Staff Jeans Fundraiser before Christmas. The Staff raised \$1,100 to be donated to families in our District. He noticed a lot of giving going on from the staff and community members.

Mr. Wood announced that the projectors donated by the PTO were all installed over Winter Break in the PK-6 classrooms. He wanted to thank Miller Electric for the timely work and for our MStM Custodial Staff for their hard work in finishing up the installation and clean up. They did a great job!! The teachers are very excited about the projectors and have been finding new ways of using them. The PTO is excited about providing document cameras for the staff next year. Thank you again to the PTO for their donations and hard work with their fundraisers.

V. Old Business

A. Reports

1) Facilities Report – Newsum discussed a range of issues and the need to set up a meeting with the Facilities Committee. One of the issues is discussing the use of the school space and a possible fee schedule. Bunch reviewed with the Board that there is a process and a form to complete. There is no charge to those that live in our District but to pay for a custodial fee. Multiple discussions have been made about what it fair to charge. It is difficult to have a one fee schedule for all requests. We also need to realize that we can't be open 24-7 because we would need to increase the hours of our custodians.

1) Principal's Report Tom Wood

Character Counts! Students Demonstrating Responsibility

Projectors were installed in all PK-6 classrooms and the elementary library. The PTO funded the project with the intention of adding document cameras next year. Maintenance completed all work over Winter Break. Thank you for your donation and hard work!!

ITBS testing will take place January 31-February 10. The Elementary will again follow the two week schedule to break up the test times into smaller parts. Mr. Wood received positive feedback in the past about stretching out the tests.

Mr. Wood provided an update on the Daycare program. It was recommended by

the Board a year ago to save costs and reduce expenses. After having the parents complete a survey it was decided to raise the daycare rates \$10. Hours were cut back, no raises were given to daycare staff, parents provided snacks and supplies when needed, and now the balance of the Daycare Fund is just over \$19,000. It was discussed that we need to look at the balance again at the end of the school year before deciding to raise or lower rates. The current balance will help cover the spring break and summer expenses that include salaries, adding a staff member, field trips, breakfast, lunch and snacks, and other activities. Another factor that needs to be considered is the number of students which is an unknown. Newsum commented that the goal of the Board was not to make a profit but to break even. Shutt commented that we have to operate the Daycare program as a business and not lose money.

2) Principal's Report Mike Crozier

Mr. Crozier informed the Board that ITED testing will take place January 31 – February 3, 2011. The first three days will be for the important tests, like reading, math, and science as the first test of the day. The Seniors will have the option to take the Work Key test.

Mr. Crozier informed the Board about the Every Fifteen Minute Program. The program stages a car accident in the parking lot, students will be staged in the car accident, fire and rescue will be involved, police officers and a funeral director will also be involved. Every fifteen minutes a student will be pulled from class to represent another death and be isolated from the other students. Concerns are for the students who would not be comfortable in taking part in the program. The possible cost of this program could be about \$2,000 to cover the video production of the program. Mr. Crozier would like to conduct the program before Prom and Graduation.

The yearbook contract needs to be renewed. Mr. Crozier informed the Board that Amy Sowder is very happy with the current vendor, Jostens, and recommends we approve a 3-year contract and not a 5-year contract. The contract is \$7,228 each year.

Mr. Crozier and Ron Peterson informed the Board that the neighboring schools are not willing to share soccer with us this year due to a class change. For them to accept our students it would mean a bump up in a class

for them. Currently, there are only two students who have an interest in soccer.

Mr. Crozier discussed with the Board finding a solution in the supervision of the wrestling cheerleaders. Currently, Sara Franey is the Cheerleading Sponsor for all sports. In years past, we had two Cheerleading Sponsors. It was agreed with Franey that she would not be required to go to all away and Saturday wrestling matches. Coach Sweet agreed that the cheerleaders could ride the team bus to the matches but he would not be able to supervise them during the matches. Manda Gibson has volunteered to help with this situation. Mr. Crozier is recommending looking into hiring a second Cheerleading Sponsor or finding a volunteer for next year and discussing this more during budget time.

3) Curriculum Director's Report

Josh Moser

Mr. Moser informed the Board about the upcoming Professional Development on February 16, 2011. He provided the sampling of staff responses to the book *Whatever It Takes* that included characteristics of Professional Learning Centers (PLC), barriers, students, parents and community, curriculum, instruction and assessment, current realities, suggestions for implementation and improvement, and lingering questions. These responses will be reviewed with the staff at the Professional Development Day on the 16th. Mr. Moser has also invited a speaker from the AEA to join the staff on the 16th to discuss mental illness that is left out of many discussions but it is important to recognize. They will also be screening the movie "Waiting for Superman" that will depict several takes on current education.

Mr. Moser will be attending a Curriculum Network meeting in February where they will discuss new standards for the Iowa Core Curriculum.

Mr. Moser provided updated information about the Quest Mini-Grant applications that have been submitted.

4) Superintendent's Report
Supt. Newsum

Supt. Newsum informed the Board that the Winterset Meeting was rescheduled to January 19th. This regional meeting is to consider ways our districts can work together to operate more efficiently and better serve our students. Bunch and Harper will be able to attend. He discussed briefly the Communication Committee meeting that met prior to the Board Meeting and ways they will be working on how to promote our District. He discussed with the Board that he located the Board Goals for 2008-2011 that were updated a year ago and a workshop meeting will be set up to update the goals again.

Supt. Newsum received a formal request from the Martensdale St. Marys Education Association to begin negotiations for 2011-2012 in February 2011. We agreed to delay our initial negotiations proposal until after the legislature sets the allowable growth new money for FY12. Bunch requested to start working on the Classified Master Contract prior to negotiations. An Employee Relations meeting was set for January 26, 2011 at 5:00.

Supt. Newsum provided to the Board information provided by the IASB at a January 4th AEA Superintendent's meeting regarding the upcoming legislative session. It is being predicted that the legislature will set the allowable growth for FY12 at 2% and will fully fund it at that level. Additional information was provided regarding IPERS. Beginning July 1, 2011, the amount of money districts must contribute into the IPERS retirement program will increase by 2%.

Supt. Newsum informed the Board that the Instructional Support Program for the MStM District will need to be renewed. The Instructional Support Program is funded by a combination of property taxes and Iowa income tax surtax providing about \$229,000 to the General Fund. These funds can be used for general fund expenses and personnel. He reviewed the Boards options and timelines and recommended that we begin the process of promoting it for the voters and include it in the September 2011 election. Supt. Newsum recommended

starting the process at the February Board Meeting.
